### Welcome to your February 2022 Newsletter.

### **Gregory (Greg) Gifford**



The Retired Members Association is sad to report the passing of Greg Gifford. Greg had a rare form of inoperable cancer.

Greg passed away peacefully at his home on the 23RD November 2021. Greg was aged 69. A funeral service for Greg was held on the 3RD December 2021 at Creighton's Lawn Cemetery & Memorial Park, Palmdale.

Greg was a member of the Retired Members Association for over nine years.

Greg commenced with the PMG on the 20<sup>TH</sup> of January 1969 as a Technician in Training. Early in his career, Greg worked at Peakhurst, Kingsgrove, Hurstville, Randwick, Blakehurst, Miranda, Cronulla exchanges, including one of the first ARE11 installations. Next, Greg went to work in the NDC Lines and Network Augmentation Project Management Team, managing databases and progress reports from field teams before leaving Telstra in March 2001 after 34 years.

In retirement, Greg used his entrepreneurial skills and set up his own business building audio speakers and providing maintenance on hospital electronic equipment.

Outside of work, Greg was a keen motorsports enthusiast for many decades. Highlights include his participation in the 1979 Repco Reliability Trial Rally in a GTS Monaro. He also had success in the Southern Cross Rallies and was also a Queensland State Champion in the early 2000s.

Greg is survived by his soulmate Narelle.

The Retired Members Association extends its profound sympathy and condolences to Narelle, family members and his former workmates.




Revesby Workers Club 28 Brett Street, Revesby

The boarding house at Mudgee Was run by Pearl Winks She was a spartan worker With motherly instincts


She kept a tidy kitchen And all the rooms were neat But pity wouldn't help you If you didn't wipe your feet

#### **Notices of Motion**

There was a survey late last year on a change of name and the broadening eligibility to become a member of our Association. The committee considered both matters as significant milestones. Hence, the need was to canvas the opinion of as many members as possible.

One hundred forty-one members participated in the survey. Thirty-one per cent of members preferred our name change to "Retired Telecommunications Employees Association", twice as many as other options for the name change proposals. On broadening membership eligibility, an overwhelming 95 per cent of members agreed on a broadened eligibility. You will find full details of the survey results in the November 2021 issue of the newsletter.

Now, members at the February General Meeting will have the opportunity to approve or otherwise change our constitution to reflect broadened eligibility and the name change. Accordingly, the meeting will consider both matters separately. You will find the text for the two notices of motion on page 2 of the newsletter.

### \$250 Regional Seniors Travel Card

Back in March 2020, the newsletter featured an article about the Seniors Regional Travel card. The travel card provides seniors with \$250 for travel such as the payment of fuel, pre-booked Trainlink services and taxis. We featured the article back then because the travel card was introduced with little fanfare. It would seem there is little fanfare again with the 2022 card.

For more information and access to the online application, visit

https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/regionalseniorstravel or call Services NSW on 13 7788. You may have to wait up to 20 business days from the time of application for your card and pin to arrive.

Please have a read below about how to apply for the card and eligibility requirements.

It is important to note if you already have a card, you will need to create a new login with a new username for your 2022 card (you cannot add your 2022 card to your existing card login on the card services website. The regional seniors travel card provides eligible seniors living in regional, rural and remote areas of NSW with a \$250 prepaid card to help ease the cost of travel. You can use the card at certain retailers to pay for:

- ♦ pre-booked NSW TrainLink Regional trains and coaches,
- **♦** fuel
- ♦ and taxis.

The travel card is valid for 14 months from the date the card is issued. The expiry date is available on the front of the card. The regional seniors travel card program is available for a 2-year trial period (2020-2021).



Eligibility for the trial, you must be:

- ♦ receiving the Age Pension (you must have received the Age Pension for at least one month); or
- ♦ a Commonwealth Seniors Health Card holder (you must have held your card for at least one month); and
- ♦ living outside of Sydney, Newcastle and Wollongong.

The trial will be expanded in the coming months to include more seniors receiving pensions from the Department of Veterans' Affairs. You will be eligible if you are:

- ♦ aged over 66 years
- ♦ you reside outside of Sydney, Newcastle and Wollongong
- ♦ you receive one of the following pensions:
- ♦ Service Pension
- ♦ Disability Pension under the Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986
- ♦ War Widow(er) Pension
